***Part C: Short Answer***

1. [4 Points]

Overloading: could be in same class (1 mark), same name (1 mark)

Overriding: must be in subclass (1 mark), same signature (1 mark)

2. [6 Points]

(2 marks) position in the hash table is based on object's hash code when inserted

(2 marks) changing object's state will change its hash code, but not its position in table

(2 marks) attempts to find object using its new hash code will likely fail

3. [6 Points]

(2 marks each):

Less code to write

Less code to test

Single source of error to correct

4. [4 Points]

(2 marks) The implementer retains ownership and control of the copy

(2 marks) Subsequent changes to the original object are not reflected in the copy

5. [5 Points]

Is immutability property broken? Why or why not? If so, how can it be fixed?

(1 mark) Yes

(2 marks) Although final, the state of “date” can still be changed by client

(2 marks) Make return a copy of the date object instead

(e.g., return new Date(date.getTime());)

6. [5 Points]

(1 mark) No

(4 marks) The terms are contradictory

Or

“abstract” means that it must be overridden, but “final” means that cannot be overridden
